The next meeting will be held on Monday, September 27, 2021 at 7:30 a.m. via remote teleconference.

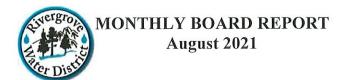

- We are nearing the finish line and Emery is completing items from the punch list which must be completed by 9/1 (See attached list)
 - Paving, fencing, and landscaping are the major items left; no problems are anticipated
 - With the cooler nights approaching, hydroseeding will be done when the fence is complete
- EPA visit on 9/22 for compliance requirements for AIS has been changed to a virtual site visit

- Backflow Program

- The office has been inundated with calls from customers requesting installation and testing referrals
 - Customers are angry due to the expenses they have incurred and price gouging
 - We are providing backflows to customers as needed and performing site visits to addresses where the irrigation system has been abandoned
- O Annual inspections are due September 30, 2021
- Current District statistics are as follows:

• Total number customer backflows: 602 (based on survey)

Current percent tested: 33%Total Connections Passed: 182

• Total Connections Failed: 14

- Water System Survey (Inspection)

- o After weeks of preparation, we are ready for the survey; OHA has suspended survey dates due to the current health crisis facing the country
- Water Management and Conservation Plan (WMCP)
 - O District and RH2 personnel are working on the WMCP plan; good progress has been made and we are on-track to submit the plan by October 23, 2021
- Production vs Consumption Report
 - Unmetered water loss dropped 9% from June to August
 - This loss is consistent with the June billing cycle which is good and bad
 - The upcoming report in October will lead us in the direction we take for future leak detection
